✓ Initiatives taken by the cell during the entire academic year:

✓ Report of UGC Sponsored Two Day National Level Seminar on 'Impact of Economics Reforms on Indian Economy' held on 5th and 6th October 2012:

Prof. Dr. N. D. Patil Mahavidyalaya, Malkapur is located at Shahuwadi Taluka which belongs to hilly and remote region of Western Maharashtra. It is generally agreed in Studies on Indian economy that the Process of economy reforms was initiated in India by the government of P. V. Narasimha Rao in 1991 with the announcement of a number of measures for liberalizing the economy by the then finance minister Manmohan Singh. This new economic policy had moved the Indian economy toward increased outward and inward competition by the end of 1980. It is precisely because of this reason that in most of the studies on Indian economy. The process of economic reform is assumed to have started in 1991. Our college has taken an initiative to address the issues related to Economic Reforms and Indian Economy by organizing two day national level seminar entitled 'Impact of Economics Reforms on Indian Economy'.

Objectives of the Seminar:
